Reminders:

Please be sure to send appropriate outdoor clothing for the weather. Gym shoes are appreciated for those that are walking and those that are beginning pulling up as we can go out on our playground. We are able to go outside more now that the weather is getting nicer! We do apply sunscreen for children 6 months and older, but also ask that you send a sun hat to school each day to help protect them from sun exposure.
